North Dakota Reading Corps is a multi-region initiative to help every child become a successful reader by the end of third grade. The program places AmeriCorps members as literacy tutors in Fargo, Jamestown, West Fargo, Mandan, and Bismarck schools plus three child care centers to implement researched-based early literacy efforts to help struggling readers. Tutors work one-on-one with students who are below proficiency in reading. Reading Corps tutors serve 15 or 20 hours per month August through May. Tutors receive training on program's curriculum and receive multiple layers of coaching support to help them in their service to students. ## Grand Forks Housing Authority—Grand Forks, North Dakota

CSI: Grand Forks is a program that aims to provide educational support to elementary-aged students in Grand Forks, North Dakota. Two types of AmeriCorps members provide direct service with youths in two different settings. Tutors actually go into a public school, working with children one-on-one for thirty minute periods. The other members provide homework help, mentorship, and positive supports to children in an after school program setting, which runs from 3:00 pm to 5:30 pm. The location of the after school program is at LaGrave Learning Center. Through lesson-planning, assessments, motivational surveys, and with the help of many volunteers, the members are able to provide an opportunity for growth for the children served, making a difference in their own lives, those of the children/families served, and the community as a whole.
